- C. What is it about trials and persecution that causes people to make decisions for Christ?
- D. Jesus gave warning signs of His return so that "Those who heed the warning will be saved." How are Christ's gracious warnings impacting the way that you live your life?
- 1. What made it so hard for the disciples to completely believe that the temple would be destroyed? Who else had a hard time with the idea?
- 2. Why did Jesus not tell the disciples that this prophecy was for two times? (Is it possible that we too could be not understanding prophecy completely?)
- 3. How did the rabbis interpret the signs Jesus predicted? What should we get from them?
- 4. Read Luke 21:12-19. Was this to be a literal or figurative happening before the destruction of Jerusalem or for later or for both? (In other words, will it happen?)
- 5. What happens to those who witness persecution?
- 6. How many Christians were lost in the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD?
- 7. Read Matthew 24:21. What did Jesus mean?
- 8. To what location did the false Christ's draw people? Is there any significance to that?
- 9. Do you have any problem with Matthew 24:34-35?
- 10. Why did Christ not tell exactly when He would return? (See question 12)
- 11. Why did Jesus describe the last days to those of Noah?
- 12. How will Jesus come to those who are not watching? (See question 10)
- 13. Why give the last warnings of Luke 21:34-36? How easy will it be to fall into this trap?
